## ultra-widefield retinal imaging



The Optomap<sup>®</sup> exam is fast, painless and comfortable. To have the exam, you simply look into the device one eye at a time (like looking through a keyhole) and you will see a comfortable flash of light to let you know the image of your retina has been taken.

With these images, your doctor is able to view your macula, optic nerve, and blood vessels.

Your doctor recommends you have this exam done **every year** in order to detect and/or monitor the onset of diseases like macular degeneration, diabetes, hypertension, and glaucoma.

While eye exams generally include a look at the front of the eye to evaluate health and prescription changes, a thorough screening of the retina is critical to verify that your eye is healthy.

As with many advanced medical technologies, insurance will not cover this diagnostic screening. The fee for the Optomap<sup>®</sup> is \$39. We will collect this fee along with your co-payment and deductibles at the end of today's visit.
